Some help to allow you to complete your answers about your own computer above ...

- Brand Names:** The names like "*Compaq*", "*Hewlett Packard*" etc tell us who made or marketed the computer, but not much about it's size and other important attributes
- PC or Apple Mac** If you are using an *Apple Mac* (a *Macintosh* made by *Apple Computers*) we regret that we do not have the facilities to tutor you in its correct use, but there is a *SeniorNet* distance-learning programme for you. You can get details from the Course Manager.
- Operating system:** **Right-click** on the "*My Computer*" icon on your *Desktop*, then left-click on '*Properties*'. Look at the '*General*' tab and under '*System*' you will see the type and version of your *Operating System*.
- Word Processor:** **Click** on Start/then Programs/ then read the list of programs looking for names like *Microsoft Word*, or *Microsoft Works*. Click on the item to ensure that it has been installed and is operating. It will come up on the screen.
- Version of Word** **Open Word** and click on "*Help*", then slide down to '*About*', and click. Then read the name and version near the top of that panel.
- Remember** that your tutor is always available to help you, so if you find difficulty in answering the above questions about your computer and the programs you use, talk it over with your tutor. We only need the information to ensure that we are guiding you into the correct learning programme to suit your home computer.
